SCHOOL UNIFORM



DOGS

We understand that quite a number of you have a well-loved family dog and that it is convenient to walk the dog to school with you in the mornings/afternoons. Whilst we appreciate that most dogs are harmless, and that most parents clean up after their pets, in the interest of health and safety, please do not bring dogs onto the school grounds.

CAR EMISSIONS

It has been noticed that some parents, when collecting children, leave their car engine running as they wait. Idling engines release harmful chemicals, gases and particle pollution into the air. These gases and particulates are unhealthy for children, adults and the environment. Research suggests that leaving just one engine idling for 10 minutes on every school day would create 1,520 m³ of excess fumes – enough to fill 46 shipping containers! We would ask, therefore, that you ensure whoever collects your child is aware of this, PLEASE, in order to help keep our children and environment healthy, switch off your engines.


CAR PARKING
